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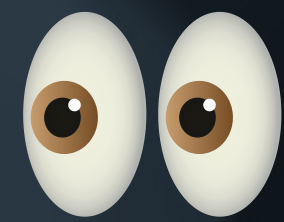

## WHY DRAW THE LINE

All forms of sexual activity, including sharing nudes, require consent.

**If your friend isn't into it, then she is not consenting.**

## WHEN TO DRAW THE LINE

No does not mean try harder. Nobody has the right to pressure you into anything. Trust your gut.

**Bottom line: everyone has the right to say no if they feel uncomfortable and have their boundaries respected.**

## HOW TO DRAW THE LINE

**There's always more than one option for a bystander. Take a stand safely and do something you feel comfortable with. You could:**

- **Listen to her:** Let her talk it out.
- **Support her:** Remind her that she doesn't have to do anything she doesn't want to.
- **Assist her:** Help craft a response to the DM.
